## General Comments

### Content

You managed to describe the picture and answered both questions from the task. Personally, I would give a more detailed description, mentioning the shadows shapes (triangle, square, circle) and the fact that the figure is lit with three rays of light. Detailed descriptions make a favourable impression on the reader. Other than that, the content is good.

### Organisation

The writing is adequately divided into paragraphs. Linking devices are present, although they are simple and aren't always used properly. Pay special attention to the word 'because'.
